COMPREHENSIVE LISTING OF SERVICES (DFACS)

TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE for NEEDY FAMILIES

(TANF) - Program provides financial and medical assistance to meet basic needs of families and maintain children in their homes. Medicaid is an automatic benefit for TANF recipients.

ELIGIBILITY: Must have child(ren) in the household less than 18 years of age, meet resource limit and income limit set by Georgia Legislature.

FOOD STAMPS PROGRAM(FS) - provides monthly benefits in the form of food coupons to low income families to help pay for the cost of food.

ELIGIBILITY: Meet resource limits and income limit which is based on the Federal poverty level.

TANF-RELATED MEDICAL SERVICES PROGRAM,

(ARM), provides programs through which financially needy individuals (pregnant women and /or children under 18 years of age) may obtain medical assistance. Major Medicaid program is

RIGHT FROM THE START MEDICAID, (RSM), for pregnant women ages 19 and under, and/or children up to one month.

ELIGIBILITY: Meet income limits (according to the program), which are based on TANF limits of the federal poverty level.

Must meet resource limits which vary according to the program.

OTHER MEDICAID: provides assistance to adults and children who need nursing home care, in home care, and to the aged, blind, and/or disabled individuals (most classes of Medicaid have both an income and resource test for approval.)

FOSTER CARE SERVICES: Temporary placement of children in approved agency facility, while working with birth parents to reunite family.

CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES: To report suspected abuse, neglect or sexual exploitation of children. Role of Agency to make assessment, identify risk, and provide services to correct the maltreatment.

ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES: To report suspected abuse, neglect, or exploitation of an adult, in a domestic setting, in a nursing home or personal care home.

HOMEMAKER SERVICES: Specialized services to maintain individuals and families in their own homes by assisting with maintenance and management.

SUBSIDIZED CHILD CARE: The purchase of child care services for participants in the State's, education/training programs, and other income eligible families who are working, in school, or job training.

ADOPTION: Permanent placement of children legally free for adoption.

SHELTER SERVICES for BATTERED WOMEN: To make referrals for victims of domestic abuse to go to one of three shelters located within close proximity.

EMERGENCY ENERGY ASSISTANCE: To provide assistance in paying a past due utility bill, when cutoff is imminent, if income guidelines are met. Available only once in a twelve month period.

MEDICAID TRANSPORTATION: To assist Medicaid eligible clients in finding providers to transport to medical appointments.

MEDICAL EMERGENCIES: Limited assistance with prescriptions for income eligible individual not covered by Medicaid, and who cannot pay for medicine.

SHARE: Energy Assistance Program operated in conjunction with the Georgia Power Company. The Salvation Army administers this program statewide. Will assist with energy bills one time only. Circumstances that prevent an individual from paying their utility bill must exist.

SPECIAL SERVICES: The process for **CHILD SUPPORT RECOVERY** can be initiated locally at this office.

NEW EYES FOR THE NEEDY attempts to provide better vision for the low-income person by providing all or part of the cost for glasses. Does not pay for the examination.
