Focus Topic: Employment Bootcamp

Danielle Avelar, Outreach and New Program Coordinator for WorkSource Georgia Mountains gave an informative presentation about a new Employment Bootcamp. A copy of her presentation is included as an attachment to the email for these minutes. Area employers had requested assistance in developing their workforce by offering opportunities for recent high school graduates to learn and to practice essential work skills. Deadline for application is May 12th. <u>www.gmrc.ga.gov/bootcamps</u>

The dates for Gainesville City Schools are May $24^{th} - 27^{th}$ at the One-Stop offices. Another bootcamp will be offered at North Georgia Technical College in Toccoa June 14th, 16^{th} , 21^{st} , and 23^{rd} . Approximately 18 - 20 students (maximum) will be participating in each of these training opportunities. Referrals are required for all.

Partner Updates: Partners were asked to offer updates for their respective organizations.

WorkSource Georgia Mountains <u>https://www.gmrc.ga.gov/wsgm</u> Ebony Tucker, Youth Program Supervisor reported: The GED program has reopened at the One-Stop Center. Staff members have been contacting community resources who will be coming in to talk with students this summer about topics related to their education, employment, and health.

Niki McPherson reported: Temporary work experience opportunities are available for eligible individuals. This includes dislocated workers and those who have been unemployed for an extended period. https://www.gmrc.ga.gov/copy-of-wsgm-career-coach WorkSource is also working with health departments to

fill 90 positions at vaccination sites.

Georgia Department of Labor <u>https://dol.georgia.gov/</u> Stephanie Ponce reported: Employers list positions daily on Employ Georgia. There are 224,082 jobs currently posted statewide. It is likely that unemployment benefits will be extended for at least an additional thirteen weeks. The GDOL website indicates a federal unemployment rate of 6.2%; State of Georgia rate of 4.8%; and Ga. Mtns. region rate of 3.4%.

Lanier Technical College <u>https://www.laniertech.edu/</u> Shannon Cole reported: This year's GOAL winner has been announced. Donations to support training costs have been received recently from local Rotary Clubs, and additional funding is being sought. LTC is at 75% of the targeted enrollment for the year. Since July 1st, 150 GED Certificates have been issued.

Jim Watson reported: Manufacturing IET will be offered in a three-week program. This includes training in first aid, OSHA 10, and soft skills. Short term training in welding and in Excel is also available. There is a new collaboration for a Business Administration Program between LTC and Brenau University.

North Georgia Technical College <u>https://northgatech.edu/</u> Shelby Ward reported: Classes for OSHA forklift operators and for home health aides are being offered, as well as programs for a Certified Literate Community. Several grants for training have been received recently, but additional training funds are being sought. 100% of targeted enrollment goals for the year are being met.

GVRA- Georgia Vocational Rehabilitation Agency <u>https://gvs.georgia.gov</u> Corin Morgan reported: Vocational Rehabilitation continues to operate offices in Cumming, Gainesville, and Cleveland. Services are still mostly remote. There has been an increase in referrals. Applications are being taken for a wait list.

Georgia Dept. of Community Supervision (DCS) <u>https://dcs.georgia.gov/locations/gainesville</u> Tonya White reported: She is continuing to seek resources for men and women who are being released from prison. GED training and WorkSource services have been useful in assisting individuals to gain employment.

Workforce Strategies Group - Greg Vitek reported: A steering committee meeting was held recently with area employers. Work is continuing with manufacturing as the focus area for Sector Strategies for the region. Videos about employment skills are being produced in each county, and these will be available to all school systems in the region in a digital library. A logo for advanced manufacturing is being developed. Also, an apprenticeship program for manufacturing technician is being created. Discussions are being held with employers about funding to sustain sector strategy efforts for the region.

Gateway Domestic Violence Center <u>https://www.gatewaydvcenter.org/</u>Cindy Bryant, Transitional Housing Program Coordinator reported: Gateway is hoping to break ground soon on their new facility.
