Focus Topic: Legacy Link

Veronica Schweitzer, Kinship Care Coordinator for Legacy Link offered information about the history and services of Legacy Link. She provided a newsletter and resource guide to everyone. Information about Legacy Link can be found at the website: <u>https://www.legacylink.org/</u>

Veronica also shared a compelling story about a successful collaboration involving a multitude of local and regional organizations working together to provide needed services for a local family. Home care for a special needs child was the one missing essential component that was vitally needed. That service was provided through the CCSP (Community Care Services Program) of Legacy Link. In-home childcare enabled the single mother of that special needs child to complete her GED, and to continue her education to become a sociology/gerontology professional in a human services organization. Veronica then revealed that the mother in the story was herself!

The Community Care Services Program (CCSP) of Legacy Link helps people who are elderly and/or functionally impaired to continue living in their homes and communities. Although Legacy Link is usually associated with a wide range of services for older adults, this program can also provide crucial funding for a broader spectrum of needed services.

<u>Changes in Unemployment Effective 6/27/21:</u> To be eligible for state Unemployment Insurance (UI), individuals must: Be unemployed through no fault of their own. Be monetarily eligible (have enough wages from past employers to qualify). Be able to work. Be available for work. Actively seek work. Report weekly work search. Be registered with Employ Georgia. Not refuse suitable work, if offered.

Additional Details: Georgia regulations allow claimants to receive up to 26 weeks of UI benefits. Eligible claimants will receive a weekly benefit amount ranging from \$55 to \$365 per week, based on their previous earnings.

GDOL provides extensive online support to job seekers looking to rejoin the workforce. Claimants receive access to Employ Georgia's job listings, résumé assistance, career counseling, skills testing, job fair information, job training services, and accessibility and special accommodations for people with disabilities and veterans transitioning back into the workplace. The Agriculture Program students have planned and planted a Milpa Garden in the NGTC Experiment/Research Station off Tech School Road on the back side of the campus. The philosophy of a Milpa Garden is that a symbiotic relationship between multiple species of vegetable plants will produce a substantial amount of food while at the same time building soil health for future plantings. The garden is a collaborative effort between the National Milpa Association, the Habersham Food Bank and NGTC Agriculture. The Milpa Association donated the seed mix to NGTC Agriculture with the understanding that a portion of the produce would be given to the Habersham Food bank to help supply local families in need with healthy locally grown whole foods. The garden represents one of the ways community collaborations can offer opportunities for student learning, return support services and goods to our community, and requires very little input from the college. Another name for the Milpa Garden is Chaos Garden. There are no rows of any one type of plant. The plants are comingled and provide shade for the soil to help retain moisture and keep the soil cool. The corn will provide vertical structure for the running beans, the beans will fix nitrogen into the soil for the corn, and the squash varieties will provide organic material as they complete their life cycle and decay back into the soil.
