# Focus Topic: Barriers to Employment - Mr. Stacey Reece, Owner, Spherion Staffing, Gainesville, GA

Mr. Reece shared tips concerning employment and recruitment from his 25 years owning and operating a local franchise of Spherion Staffing. He gave examples of 'subtle' ageism in the workplace. These can include comments about graduation dates; whether person has grandchildren; whether person is considering retirement sometime soon; and references to skills in technology. He mentioned that employers are aware that older workers often have excellent work ethics, and are dependable, skilled workers. The EEOC (Equal Employment Opportunity Commission) identifies the class of workers who are considered in the group who may face ageism as those who are age 40 or older. Job postings now have algorithms that detect age factors on resumes. The recommendation for resumes is one page, presenting 'a fresh picture of who you are'. Encouraging job seekers to take jobs paying at least \$15 per hour.

GDOL is working on assisting employers with referrals for job candidates listed in our system. It would be helpful if employers would report "no shows, or job refusals". This would help the agency investigate these matters.

Unemployment Rate (Statewide): In February 2022, Georgia's unemployment rate held steady to 3.2 percent over the month. Rate was 4.6 percent in February a year ago.

Jobs: In February 2022, total nonfarm employment in Georgia was up 24,700 over the month and employment is up 232,000 over the year.

Claims: In February 2022, Georgians filed 22,077 initial claims for unemployment benefits; down 6,180 over the month and down 89,231 over the year.

Many people who live in Gainesville Housing properties <u>are</u> working. Some who are not working are young mothers who were bumped from employment during the pandemic. They could not work from home, and childcare became unavailable or cost prohibitive. One of the largest barriers to employment is the presence of mental/behavioral health issues. There is a lot of depression and anxiety for individuals living with a low income. It is very difficult for individuals who are working at low income jobs to take days off for short-term training, even if that training could lead to a higher paying job. This is a challenge for all concerned.
