Focus Topic: North Georgia Technical College Programs - Shelby Ward introduced Katie Johnson who presented an interesting program about programs at North Georgia Technical College that are designed to introduce area high school students to the many educational options and opportunities available there. She shared information about a recruitment program inviting eighth graders in the area to visit the campus at NGT to learn more about career training in specific areas that interested them. These were called "Color Tours". Hands-on activities were offered during the fifteen minute sessions, and groups of students rotated between various color-coded areas of training options. Many eighth graders tend to choose occupations like that of their parents. This program allowed the students to explore additional vocational areas. Three of the eleven middle schools served by North Georgia Technical College participated in the Color Tours program this year. This involved about 500 students. An expansion of the program is planned for next year.

Legacy Link, Inc.: Kelley Johnson https://legacylink.org/ Provides work training hours to participants 55+ to increase marketable skills to assist them in obtaining unsubsidized employment. Participants must be 55+, at or below 125% federal poverty guidelines. Host site recruitment is ongoing. Seeking 501c3 organizations or government agencies – state or federal as host sites for workers. Legacy Link provides services in 90% of Georgia's counties.

Gainesville High School: Steven Cornett, WBL (Work Based Learning) Coordinator https://ghsweb.gcssk12.net/advanced-studies/work-based-learning-new

Work Based Learning (WBL) has grown. This is a class where students can get class credit while working in

internships and getting paid. These internships cover a wide variety of industries and fields of work. Have added a second WBL coordinator. Highest numbers ever. 265 individual students participated for a total of over 76,000 hours with documented pay of over \$846,000. Students are gaining work experience, and for many of them, this will lead to a full time job. Learning soft skills, employability skills/ being an adult.

Natalie Smith, CTAE (Career, Technical, Agricultural Education) Program Coordinator, GHS: Just conducted annual review. Have had 390 GHS students to complete pathways this year. These are 10th,11th, and 12th graders. Valuable to have students get hands-on experience working. Of this year's 490 graduates at GHS, 59% completed at least one Career Pathway. The Dual Enrollment Program had five new partners and 220 students this year. These students earned approximately 1600 hours of college credit and they completed 24 technical career trajectories. Added more electrical and welding in addition to the CNA (Certified Nurse Assistant) program. Also, successful with AP (Advanced Placement) Program where students take test after completing a high school class and can earn college credit based on their score. Reach Scholar Program - state program for eighth graders reaching toward college but lack a strong support system. Though these students have academic coaches and external mentors, it is still a challenge to have them understand opportunities available to them.
