Potential homeowners take a financial education course with Regions Bank. Currently have an open waiting list for applicants. Habitat receives donations and grants from various sources including individuals, foundations, and civic organizations. Volunteers are welcome and

needed to assist with building projects and with fundraising efforts. Habitat Homes being built locally in Copper Glen – 30 year mortgage with 0% interest. Homeowners must provide a specific number of volunteer hours in the construction of their home. Family members and friends may assist with these volunteer hours. Building takes place on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays. Excellent partnership with Georgia Mountain Food Bank to stock pantries of new homes for move-in. Assistance is available for businesses training new and existing employees through OJT (On the Job Training), Incumbent Worker and Internship Programs. OJT can reimburse an employer 75% of a new hire's wages while they are being trained. Internships are great for employers wanting to try out a new employee without having to commit to hiring them. Pay the intern while they get experience in a new field. IWT (Incumbent Worker Training) is designed to supply funding for training of current full-time employees. Examples are training on new equipment, LEAN Six Sigma training or help ensure permanency of the business through layoff aversion

Since the last meeting, have had 52 new participants, 10 of those have completed their certifications through a welding bootcamp held at North Forsyth High School. 9 of those 10 are employed and/or transitioning to college. Also 12 of the 52 earned their GED and 3 transitioning to college. Planning for a Fall Welding Bootcamp in partnership with LCCA and MEC. Have 3 students participating in a manufacturing boot camp in partnership with Lanier Tech and Satellite Industries, Inc. Have already been hired and will complete their certifications in a few weeks. Had 2 youth successfully complete the Virtual Work Experience summer cohort and will be offering it to participants again in the fall. Accepting applications for all programs and services and working to get back on the college campuses and in schools for the upcoming school year. Dates scheduled for September to take applications for GED at all NGTC campuses.

Met 1,415 goal last year. Enrolling now – including early a.m. classes, online Sunday – support available. Need a six-hour teacher in Banks Co. 97 Adult Education students attending Lanier Tech. College for Fall Semester. 10 Workforce Certificate students. Dual enrolled – Adult Ed/College in subjects like Nurse Aide; Welding; Auto Collision Repair; Early Childhood Care and Education Basics. Also, Welding and Forklift training offered through Goodwill. Lanier Tech. College is #1 in State with 279 GEDs completed during the year.
