Focus Topic: My Sister's Place <u>https://www.my-sisters-place.org/</u> Jennifer Bero, Executive Director and Amanda Ives offered information about their organization. They explained that My Sister's Place is a homeless shelter for women and children. Located in Gainesville, it is a 90 day program, a Christian ministry offering a hand up rather than a handout. The first step with clients is to complete an assessment to identify and eliminate barriers being faced. Then steps are identified to allow client to move forward with life. Goals to reach self-sufficiency are established by the clients, with assistance provided. An assessment of progress is conducted every thirty days. Resources for childcare, for food assistance, and for job readiness are shared with the client. All clients must first pass a drug screen. Must be able to work. If actively fleeing domestic violence, individuals are referred to Gateway. Services are for women and women with children. If there is a male child, he must be under age 13. Starting to plan for spring bootcamps. Staff attending fairs, community events and facilitation workshops. Catherine Allen: Outreach Funding available for training and temporary work. Welding bootcamps – Arrendale State Prison, 11 participants, North Ga. Technical College; Hall County Corrections - 8 with Lanier Technical College, Lumpkin Co. Schools, and Satellite Industries – LTC; 9th District Opportunity – shower days; DOL overview sessions resumed. Application assistance picking up. Rally for Recovery – 450+ attendees.

Judy Reynolds: Adult/Dislocated Worker Case Manager, Amarylin Neill: Intake & Eligibility Specialist

Have 8 short term training programs – I.E.T.s (Integrated Education & Training) Adding two more: phlebotomy and medical admin. Another record enrollment at Lanier Tech – over 5,000 students. Spring semester begins Jan. 9th. Highest GED rate among Georgia Colleges. Competing to be 2nd largest program in state. At recent GED graduation, approximately 100 students walked, and over 800 people attended. Collaborating with North Ga. Technical College and others in region to offer more I.E.T. programs. Have named a new EAGLE candidate – she was formerly in prison, now is in a welding program. Finishing a workplace literacy class. Local library has made presentation to LTC students. Also, have had presentations from Forsyth Co. Sheriff's office.

An individual may participate in the program for up to four years. Trainees may work up to 21 hours per week. Pay is \$7.25 per hour. Individual may rotate from one worksite to another after six months. Some individuals are hired after their training experience.
