Focus Topic: Good News at Noon https://www.goodnewsatnoon.org/ 770 503-32667 Executive Director, Ken Gossage shared information about the history of the organization. In 1987, following a 37-year career as a schoolteacher and administrator, Gene Beckstein reached out to those in need in Gainesville. He and his wife, Margie placed a sign in their front yard inviting all who were hungry into their home for lunch. The word of their hospitality spread quickly and from this daily display of concern, "Good News at Noon" was born. The overflow crowd in their kitchen soon relocated to a seldom-used community center at Melrose Apartments, a government-subsidized low-income housing project. Churches, civic groups, families, and individuals from across Gainesville's diverse community began to align themselves with Mr. & Mrs. B in meeting immediate needs of those around them. Multiple side ministries began to sprout out of the original free lunch program. A homeless shelter was constructed, a food pantry ministry blossomed, summer school programs reached out to children of the area, and a free medical/dental clinic began and was later able to move out on their own. Today hundreds of people are fed, clothed, housed, and ministered to each year.

Ken stated that Good News at Noon will be moving into a new building as soon as all permits are secured. Hopefully, this will be by Christmas. The new address is 884 Dorsey St. The new facility will offer shelter for 40 men and for 20 women. A transitional program will offer assistance for individuals to gain skills training, employment, and more permanent housing. Partners and volunteers are needed to assist with programs.
