Tara Hardwick, Workforce Development and Education Manager After developing the Goodwill Career Center in Dawson County for five years, in 2021, Tara Hardwick accepted her current position with The Place. She also had had almost 28 years of experience as a flight attendant/instructor for American Airlines, where she learned a lot about excellence in customer service. She explained that The Place assists people of the Forsyth and Dawson County areas with essential needs and with their becoming self-sustaining. Through their many initiatives and services, they are changing lives.

The Place of Forsyth County was founded in 1975 by four Dominican Nuns. The sisters offered the residents assistance with financial needs, clothing, shelter, food, grocery shopping, and tutoring. The Place has been the catalyst for several other agencies throughout its history. In 2015, a workforce development initiative was launched to help the under-employed and unemployed prepare for and to secure jobs. The Place merged with the Dawson County's RIC-Rack thrift store in 2021, becoming The Place of Dawson. They are currently offering technical skills and life skills counseling. The organization is whole-person centered. Services are offered to anyone who needs them. Parenting Classes called 'Love and Logic' are available. GED classes and ESL classes are provided. Childcare and meals are made available to those taking classes. The staff for The Place is small. There are approximately 30 employees, with only 8 of those who are full-time. They rely on many volunteers to deliver their wide range of services. The Place does not accept direct government funding. They rely on generous donors and on private grants for operational funds. They do not require documentation. They also partner with other organizations such as Lanier Technical College and Literacy Forsyth to provide needed services.
