<u>Focus Topic</u>: Court System Programs*Jessi Emmett, Judicial Accountability Division Director, Court Administration, Northeastern Judicial Circuit for Hall and Dawson County presented an informative program about the various programs and services available through the local court system. She discussed accountability courts, family treatment services, pretrial release, drug courts, and parental accountability courts. Drug screenings are conducted every day, with 40,000 to 60,000 every year as part of their programs. Meth is a huge

problem in this area. Also, fentanyl is being laced in many drugs, and it is often fatal. Trauma is often the root cause of the problems of individuals who become part of the court system. Individuals involved in the programs are required to be employed or be involved in job training. Community service is a component of the programs. Alpha Track is for multiple offenders*Bravo/Charlie Track is for first-time offenders*Also have tracks for Mental Health and for Veterans*Resources: Partnership for Drug Free Hall.
